COVID-19:

As a club, we have agreed to a number of modifications to our clubhouse and the physical distancing recommended by our healthcare system. These changes include clubhouse restructuring to improve handwashing/sanitation, distances, and plexiglass screens for office interaction. We have given members and guests the option of wearing a mask when feasible.

5-STAND:

There are five stations, or *stands* and nine strategically placed clay target throwers (called traps). Shooters shoot in turn at various combinations of clay birds - 1 target is a rabbit which rolls along the round, rather than flying. Each station will have a menu card that lets the shooter know the sequence of clay birds he or she will be shooting at (i.e. which trap the clay bird will be coming from). Each shooter shoots at three combinations of two targets from each station. They shoot from all five stations for a total of 30 targets.

TRAP

The targets are thrown by a machine located at approximately ground level and covered by a "trap house." There are five "stations". In singles, each competitor shoots at five targets from each station with varying distances - 16 yards being the closest and 27 yards being the furthest. The trap machine oscillates left to right and the competitor does not know where the target will emerge. (The different yardages are different handicaps for a shooters ability.)

PISTOL RANGE

The pistol range has four (4) separated shooting positions or shooting lanes with safety barriers between each. There are target holders placed in the ground at 3, 5, 10, 15 and 25 yards. Strict adherence to all safety protocols is imperative. The pistol range is open seven days a week whereas shotgun activities are limited to Saturdays unless a special event is scheduled.
